Bud Light – Light Lager – 4.2% – St. Louis Missouri

Taste is fresh and snappy, light in color, with a light body. Introduced nationally in 1982, Bud Light is brewed with a malt and hop ratio different from Budweiser for a distinctively crisp taste with fewer calories. It became the country's No. 1 light beer in 1994.



Guinness Draught – Irish Stout – 4.2% – Ireland

Guinness Draught is one of the top selling imported draught beers in America. A unique mix of nitrogen gas and carbon dioxide creates the swirling liquid that tumbles, surges and eventually separates into the black liquid and the characteristic smooth creamy head that sits atop the perfect pint. With an initial malt and caramel flavor, Guinness Draught finishes with a dry roasted bitterness.



Shock Top Belgian White - Belgian Style White - 5.2%

Unfiltered Belgian-Style wheat ale, naturally cloudy, with a light golden hue and slight taste of orange.

Stella Artois – Lager – 5.2% – Belgium

Only the very best barley and the finest hops are selected for Stella Artois. The care and attention at every step in the brewing process enable Stella Artois to mature into a full-bodied and exceptionally well-balanced beer, perfectly thirst quenching, and perfect for everyday special moments.



Spotted Cow – Ale – 5.1% – New Glarus, Wisconsin

Cask conditioned ale has been the popular choice among brews since long before prohibition. We continue this pioneer spirit with our Wisconsin farmhouse ale. Brewed with flaked barley and the finest Wisconsin malts. We even give a nod to our farmers with a little hint of corn.



Spaten Oktoberfest (Germany)

Beer Style: Ur Marzen

Alcohol by Volume: 5.9%

Our Oktoberfest Beer, created in 1872, is the world's first Oktoberfest beer, brewed for the greatest folk festival in the world. Amber in color, this medium bodied beer has achieved its impeccable taste by balancing the roasted malt flavor with the perfect amount of hops. Having a rich textured palate with an underlying sweetness true to tradition.



1554 – Fort Collins, Colorado - Enlightened Black Ale - 5.6%

Other than being dark in color, 1554 has little in common with porters or stouts. This beer is fermented at relatively high temperatures using a European lager yeast that imparts a refreshing, zesty acidity. Chocolate and coffee tones in the nose give way to a surprisingly clean finish. With 1554 our staff hoped to create a beer similar to what folks enjoyed five hundred years ago without ignoring five hundred years of technological innovation.



Fat Tire – Amber Ale – 5.2% – Fort Collins, Colorado

Like the ageless delight of pedaling a bicycle, Fat Tire Amber Ale's appeal is in its feat of balance: Toasty malt flavors, (sorta like biscuits just pulled from the oven) coasting in equilibrium with crisp hoppiness. Delicious stability, in a world of precarious beer flavors, is perhaps what prompted one consumer to say, "This beer just makes you smile."

Ale

- Hefeweizen** Fruity and cloudy with a low hop profile
- Belgian White** - Refreshing and cloudy with low bitterness
- Stout** - Light-bodied, highly drinkable with a dry roasted creamy flavor
- English Bitter** - Light-bodied with a moderate to assertive hop bitterness
- Pale Ale** - A fruity copper-colored ale with a good balance of malt and hops
- Wisconsin Ale** - Light bodied, fruity and cloudy with hint of corn

- BEER KEY -

Lager

- Pilsner** - A golden lager with a flowerful aroma and dry finish
- Doppelbock** - Very full bodied with intense malty flavor and high alcohol content
- American Lager** - Light-bodied with a low to medium bitterness, balanced maltiness and a moderate hop flavor
- American Light Lager** - Light-bodied and thirst quenching with only a trace of malt flavor
- European Lager** - Light bodied with moderate bitterness and a smooth taste
